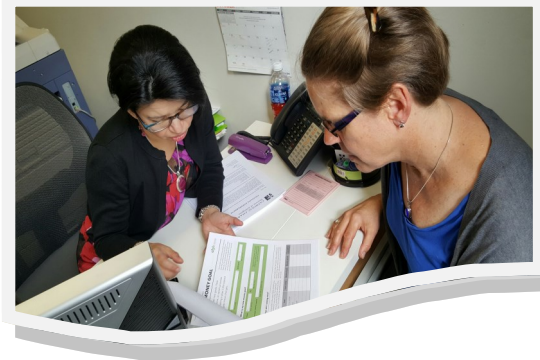


INFORMATION AND REFERRAL

Each new clothing client at Christ House is interviewed and provided with information about all available Catholic Charities services such as car ministry, employment assistance, counselling, senior services, transitional housing, etc. Clients are also referred to other community resources for needs such as: social services, housing, legal, medical, etc.



OUR CLIENTELE WHO RECEIVE FREE CLOTHING

87% of families served are below the federal poverty level (\$24,000 per year).

- The majority live in the 22305 -14 Zip Codes in Alexandria.
- The majority of these families are 1 to 3 person households (56%) headed by a female (65%).
- Almost 28% have no earned income, and about 17% have no income at all.

EMERGENCY ASSISTANCE

Emergency assistance is available at Christ House to help those experiencing a financial crisis. Assistance with rent helps prevent homelessness and assistance with bill payments prevents the cut-off of essential utilities.

Assistance is provided on:

- First-come first-serve basis
- By appointment only to those meeting Catholic Charities eligibility guidelines
- With a referral, assistance with prescription costs may be available
- Clothing vouchers are available to those in need of clothing and can be redeemed at the thrift shop

*We cannot accept computer equipment, baby furniture, toys and stuffed animals. Receipts are provided.

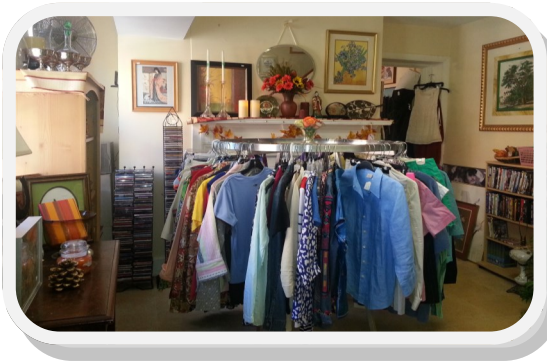
VOLUNTEER

THRIFT STORE ACTIVITIES In Fiscal Year 2017

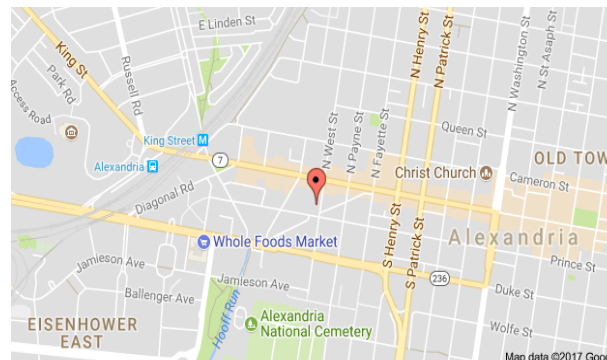
- Conducted 6,078 sales transactions
