YOU MUST BRING THE FOLLOWING DOCUMENTS TO THE WORKSHOP:

1. Legal Permanent Resident card, also known as a “green card”.
 - a. You must attend in person, with the physical green card, to complete your application.
2. All passports, current and expired, that you have used since you became a resident.
 - a. If you are an asylee or refugee please bring your travel document.
3. Starting October 28, 2025, USCIS will only accept filing fees collected through electronic debit using Form G-1650 or by credit card using Form G-1450. (Personal checks and money orders will no longer be accepted by USCIS.) Please ensure you bring either U.S. bank account information or credit card with you to the workshop. Pre-paid credit cards are acceptable. Applicants and petitioners should ensure their accounts have sufficient funds to cover all filing fees. USCIS may reject any application, petition, or request if the transaction is denied.
 - a. Applicants with low income may qualify to pay a reduced USCIS fee or apply for USCIS fee waiver. To see if you qualify, bring either a benefits award letter or last year’s tax return. If you have any question about whether you may qualify for the USCIS fee waiver or reduced fee, you can call the number listed on the first page of this flyer.
4. Dates and addresses for the last 5 years for places where you have worked, lived, and studied.
5. Are you married? You need to know your marriage date and your spouse’s birthdate, immigration number, current address and employer’s name.
 - a. Has your spouse been married before? You need to know their prior spouse’s name, place & date of birth, marriage date, and divorce date. If possible, bring the divorce certificate.
 - b. If you are applying with 3 years of residency as the spouse of a US citizen, please contact us.
6. Have you been married before? You need to know your prior spouse’s name, immigration status at the end of marriage, place & date of birth, marriage date, and divorce date. If possible bring the divorce certificate or death certificate.
7. Do you have children? You need to know each child’s place & date of birth, immigration number, and current address. This includes all children, including those who are adopted and deceased.
8. Have you EVER gotten a driving ticket? Bring your DMV record.
9. Have you EVER been arrested or gone to court? Bring all court dispositions. Depending on the seriousness of any criminal charges you have, Hogar reserves the right to decide whether or not to represent you at the workshop.
10. Are you on an IRS payment plan? Bring it along with proof of your most recent payments.
11. Men ONLY:
 - a. Bring proof of registration with the Selective Service
 - b. If you are between the age of 18 and 26, go to www.sss.gov and register! It’s the law.

We serve clients in the order of arrival, and applications can take all day to finish, so please be prepared to wait.
